modernity.*

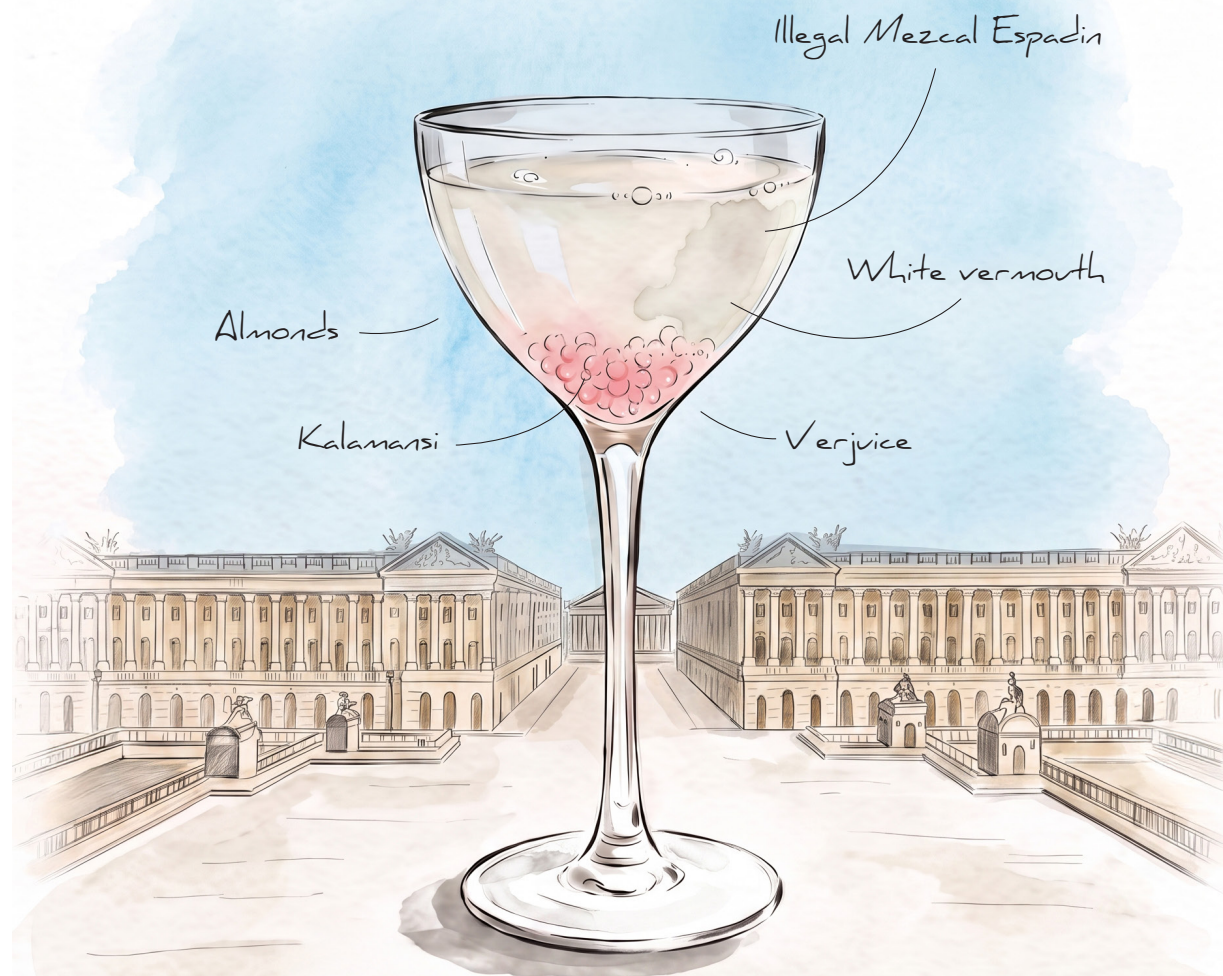

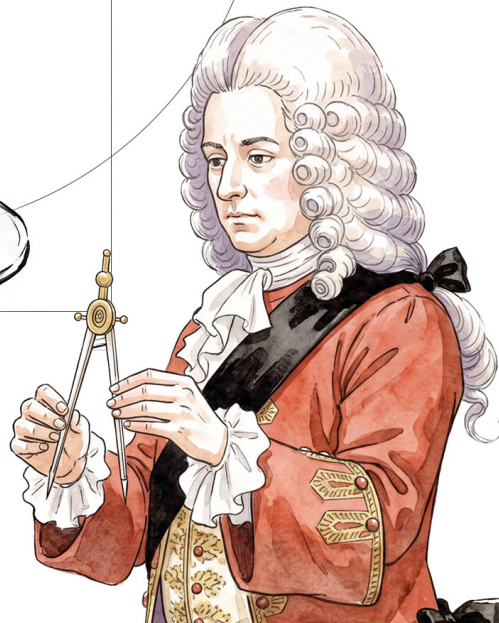
In 1758, the façades of Place Louis XV emerged, marking the first chapter in the story of Hôtel de Crillon.

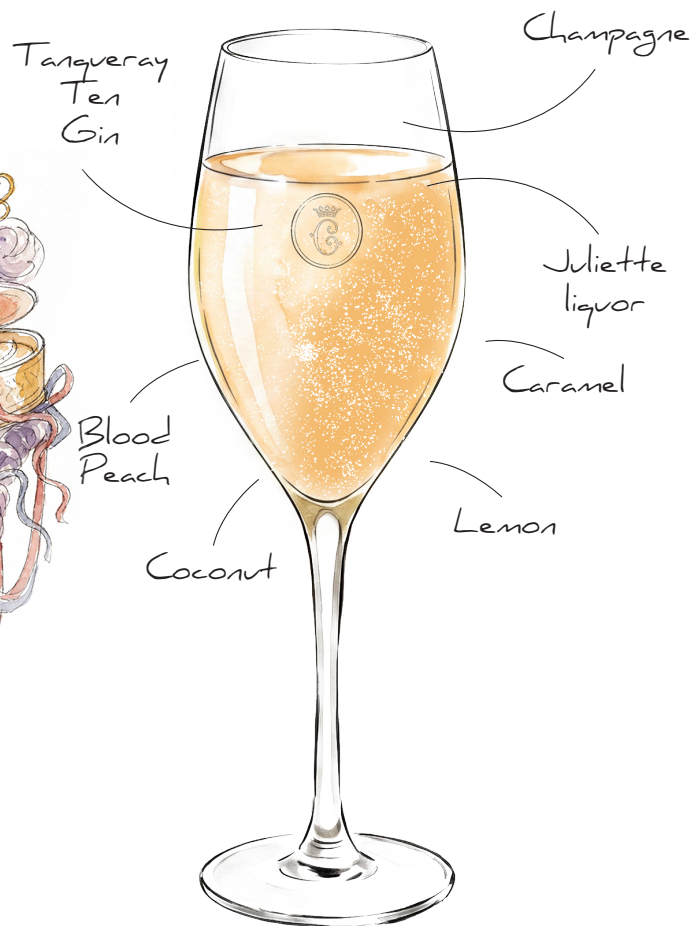
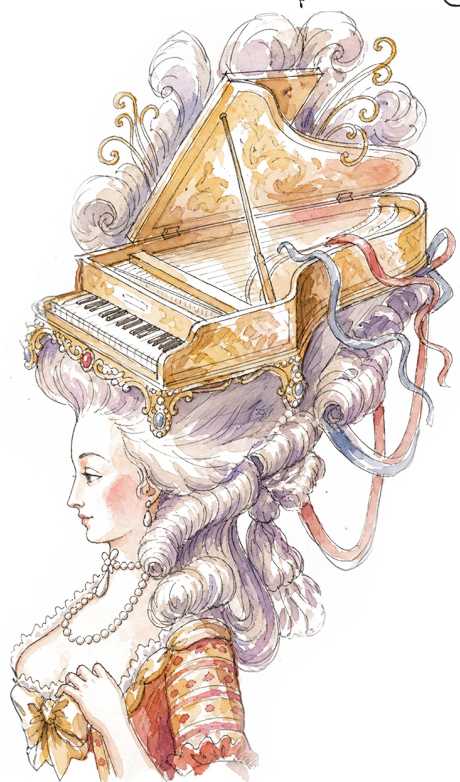


Le Duc

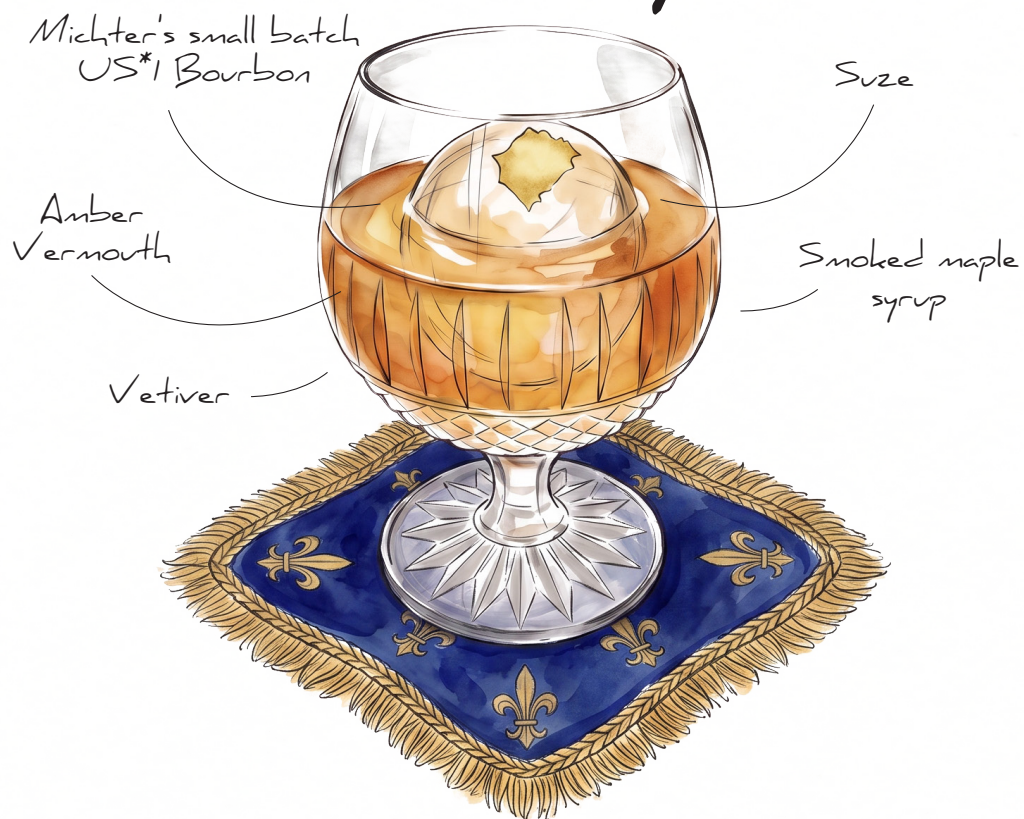
Rouge Concorde



For more than two centuries, Place de la Concorde has witnessed the transformations of Paris and its history.

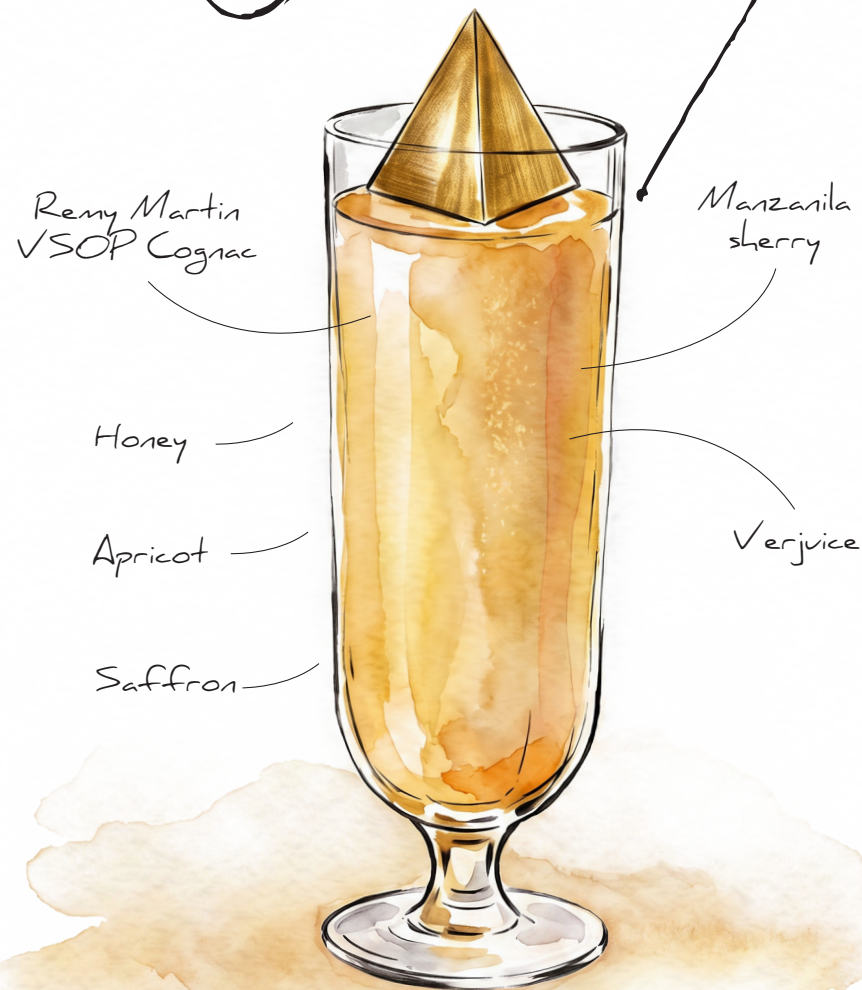

A symbol of the French monarchy, the fleur-de-lis evokes the elegance and refinement of the court that once frequented these premises.

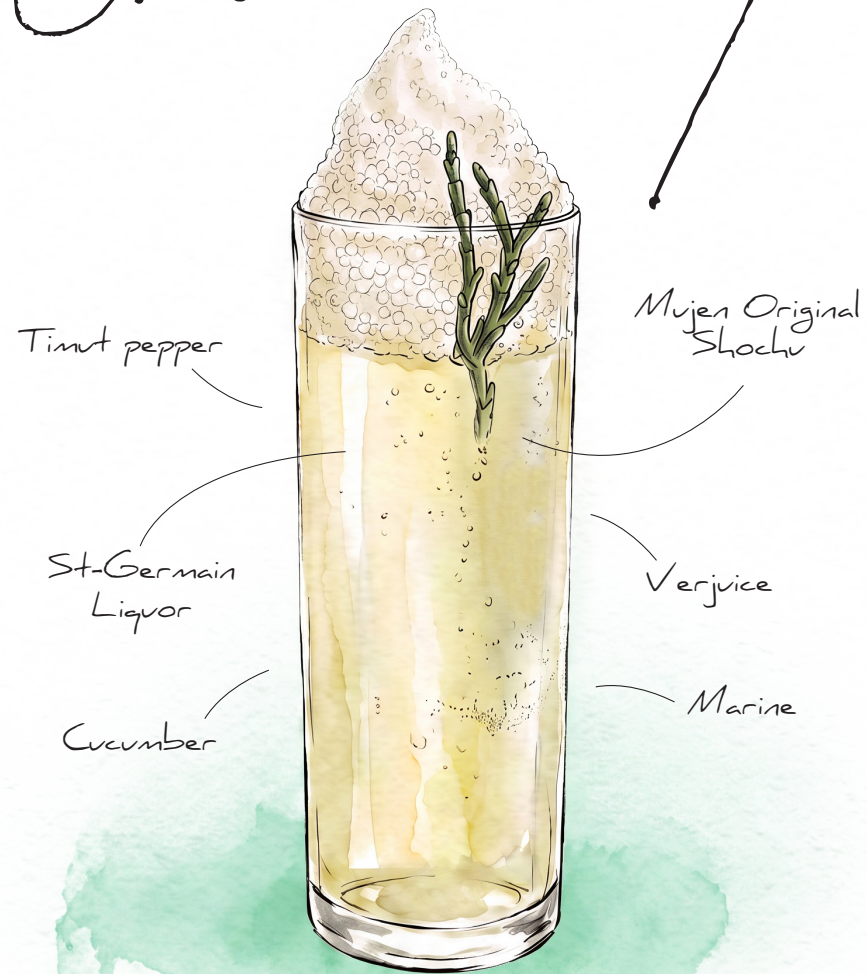
L'Obélisque
